

She also presented two posters at the annual meeting of the Association for Behavioral and Cognitive Therapies: 'Which feminist beliefs are protective? Deconstructing feminist beliefs as a protective factor against risk factors for eating pathology in a non-undergraduate population' and 'Assessing the validity of the Physical Appearance Comparison Scale in three distinct populations'.

David Dirlam was keynote speaker for the Fall Forum of the New England Educational Assessment Network. His talk was entitled Tools for Turning Course Design and Learning Data into Educational Action.

Laynee Timlin and Kathy Stolley presented on the role of community engagement in a strategic plan. VWC's newly released documentary about our winter homeless shelter, directed by Stu Minnis and Diane Hotaling, was shared with attendees.



For the fall 2014 "Readings With Wesleyan" series, **Dr. Murrell Brooks** led three sessions on "Community Transformations." The series, held at Heritage United Methodist Church, examined the music and philosophy of Tupac Shakur as it relates to contemporary movements such as Ferguson, the Arab Spring, and the civil rights movement.
